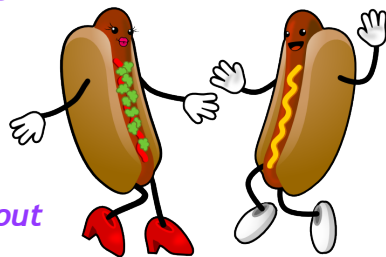

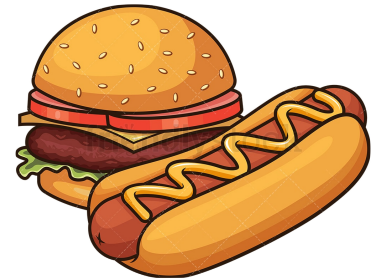

## Changes in Club Policy

All members,

Please read the document below, adopted by the Board on June 19th, 2025, it makes changes to Club policy about communicating with members with overdue accounts. These changes allow electronic communications to be considered "official" as well as certified mail. There is another change clarifying the treasurer's discretion for setting up a payment plan in some circumstances. The changes are shown in red.

This policy is in keeping with Club Bylaws, Article 1, Paragraph 5C, and Article 9, Paragraph 3.

### Changes approved 6/19/2025 to the Resolution Adopted at February 2015 Board Meeting

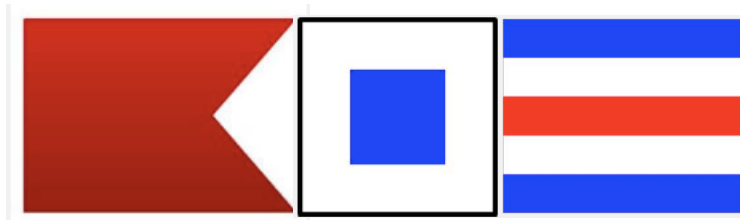
In an effort to bring overdue Club accounts current, the Board adopts the following policy, effective immediately.

1. As soon as practical following the end of each month, the Treasurer shall review the current receivables aging report.
2. Unless otherwise instructed by the Board, the Treasurer shall execute the appropriate "Notice of Overdue Account" for Members with amounts that have been outstanding for longer than 60 or 90 days using the form attached or in such form as may be adopted by future Board resolution. **The appropriate forms will be signed by the Treasurer and mailed by certified mail and/or electronically (email and/or text). A certified letter is considered delivered to the Member when USPS tracking shows it has been delivered to the address Blackbeard Sailing Club has on file for the Member.**
3. For Members with amounts outstanding longer than 120 days, the Treasurer shall provide the names and details in writing to the Board in advance of its next scheduled meeting and the Board shall determine the appropriate action up to and including termination of membership. If termination is to be made, the Board shall instruct the Commodore, by way of resolution, to execute the appropriate "Notice of Termination" using the form attached or in such form as may be adopted by future Board resolution. **The appropriate forms will be signed by the Commodore and mailed by certified mail and/or electronically (email and/or text). A certified letter is considered delivered to the Member when USPS tracking shows it has been delivered to the address Blackbeard Sailing Club has on file for the Member.**
4. The notice of termination shall inform the Member that,
  - a. he/she has 30 days to remove any property from BSC's premises,
  - b. any property remaining at BSC after this period will be considered "abandoned,"
  - c. abandoned personal property may be disposed for the benefit of the Club and
  - d. abandoned property which is titled or registered will be disposed of in accordance with applicable county, state and federal requirements.

## Changes in Club Policy

5. In the case of a Member's financial hardship or other mitigating circumstances, and where it is determined to be in the Club's best interest, the Treasurer may, at her/his discretion and in consultation with the Commodore or other Flag Officer, enter into a payment plan with a Member whose account is in arrears longer than 120 days. For the duration of the payment plan and for one year after the Member's account is current, the Member will be on probation and may lose slip privileges. If the Member's account goes into arrears for over 60 days after the payment plan is satisfied and within the probationary period, they will be terminated.
  - a. All such payment plans shall be:
    - i. designed to bring the Member's account current within six months, and
    - ii. documented in writing, signed by the Member and filed with the Treasurer and Bookkeeper.
  - b. The details of payment plans shall be provided to the Board of Directors who shall hold such information in strictest confidence.
  - c. In his/her monthly report to the Board, the Treasurer shall report on the status of any payment plans. If any Member has fallen behind in a payment plan, the Board shall determine the appropriate action.
6. In the event that a terminated member abandons property at BSC, the Board, at its discretion, shall direct as follows:
  - a. Personal property that is not titled or registered may be retained by the Club for its use, donated to a charity or non-profit organization, offered for sale to Club Members or the public, or sold at auction to the highest bidder.
  - b. For property that is titled or registered, the Secretary shall complete and file the applicable paperwork to make the property available for disposal.
  - c. The Board, at its discretion, shall determine whether the proceeds from such disposal of abandoned property, if any, are to be retained for Club use or distributed to a charity or non-profit organization.

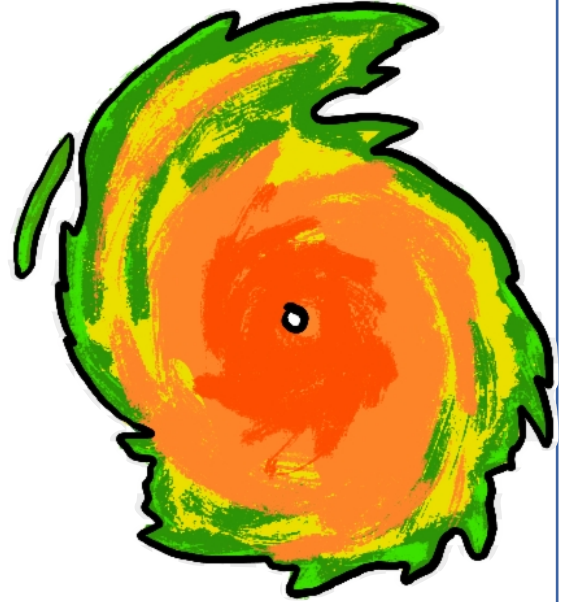
*A few reminders from the Dockmaster*

Dock lines are looking good. Thanks people!

Hurricane season is here, so make sure your boat is in order - anchors, rode, dinks, dock boxes and everything else is ready.

Check your Hurricane plan:

-  Correct phone numbers (yours and your buddy's)
-  Equipment is located and correctly documented on the plan
-  Engine runs, and importantly, dock lines can be untied
-  You can then send the updated plan to the Dockmaster

If we make the call to leave the docks, commit time for your boat, and to help with club supplies and equipments like BBQs, garbage cans, dock boxes and carts, bikes etc...

The marina is for all intents and purposes - full. Vacant slips have blank yellow boards on them. Rates for slips are posted under the clubhouse. We are generating a new waiting list, and one needs to be a member, and actually own the boat, to request a slip for it.

Finally, the end of A dock is not to be used, unless one is onboard the whole time the boat is there. B dock slips need the space for coming and going to their slips, and your boat may have to move at a moment's notice. C dock allows for 2 or 3 tie-ups. Contact the Dockmaster for overnight use.

After several glitches and delays, the new card scanner box at Barkentine is finally working. Additionally, the call button to hail the Security Guard to get in is now working. Testing of the cards discovered that swiping from bottom up within 1 inch to the scanner eye will quickly open the gate.

## ***Access with Existing RFID Card - \$5.00***

Next-gen security RFID card entry systems works similarly to our present gate cards. This integration not only enhances overall easy of use by holding up the card to the gate's scan box. The card can be used in any car.

## ***RFID Window Sticker - \$10.00***

Hands free drive thru capabilities allow users to quickly enter in real-time. The sticker should be attached to your windshield behind mirror and opens the gate automatically.



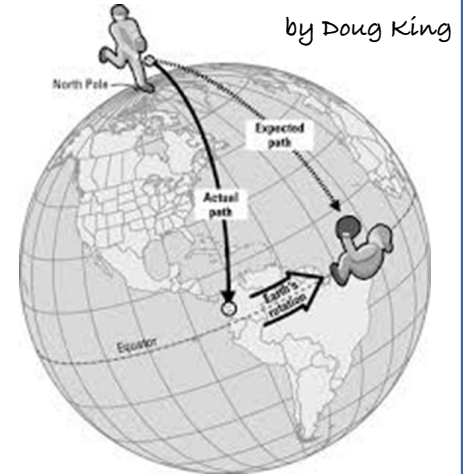

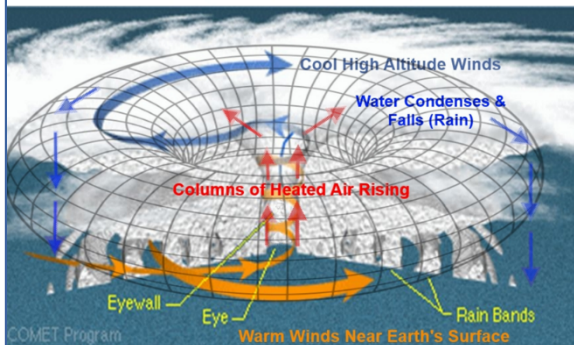
## HURRICANES - How to Cope!

Coping implies knowledge and skills, but it is also about attitude. I don't expect anybody really has a positive attitude about hurricanes, but they are a fact of life here in Eastern NC. The more we know about them, and the more we know specifically about any given one coming our way, the more confidence we can have in the actions we take.

First let's look at the mechanics of how hurricanes "work." They are fueled by the temperature difference between the warm ocean and the cold upper atmosphere. An area of low barometric pressure... say for example, 1010 millibars or 29.83 inches of mercury, this is a slight

'Low'... over an area of warm tropic ocean will develop an updraft as the air gains heat from the sea surface. This updraft lowers the barometric pressure a bit more, and winds trend inward toward the low pressure.

This is often called a "Tropical Wave" and is the beginning stage of a hurricane. So if you hear that phrase in a weather forecast, it should perk up your ears.

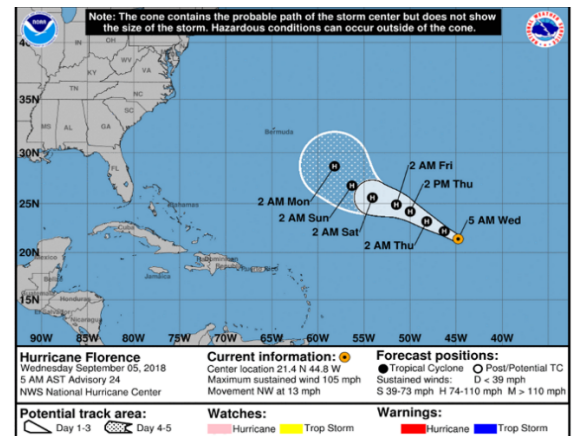
As our tropical wave's low barometric pressure pulls air into

its updraft, these winds pick up more heat and more water vapor, which in turn accelerates the updraft. The low pressure drops further, which strengthens the winds.

The next stage is "organization." This occurs because of the Coriolis force of the Earth itself. Because the Earth is rotating, its entire surface is in motion. This motion is fastest at the equator; therefore the edge of our "Tropical Wave" closest to the equator tends to get pulled along to the east. In the northern hemisphere of the Earth, the result is a counterclockwise spin to the mass of air moving towards the center of the low pressure area. When the wind and the clouds have been shaped by this, into a spiral with a noticeable clear center or eye, the weather forecasters say that it is organized. At this point, usually the winds are strong enough (20 mph) to start calling it a tropical depression.

A hurricane can be as much as 800 miles across, and the eyewall reaches altitudes of 10 miles. The column of warm, wet air rising in the eye of a hurricane is like a direct connection between the two poles or terminals of a battery. The amount of power released is incredible, tremendous... easily more than any nuclear weapon and approximately 200 times as much as the all the electrical capacity of every country on Earth's power grid.

Now that we know more about how hurricanes work, let's look at how they get to us. Fortunately, they follow relatively predictable paths. All hurricanes begin by following an east-to-west track as they develop. In the northern hemisphere, they tend to curve to the north as they get bigger. The opposite occurs in the southern hemisphere. Hurricanes are massive, and they have lots of momentum. They tend to only make slow gradual turns, but sometimes they are steered by high-altitude winds like the jet

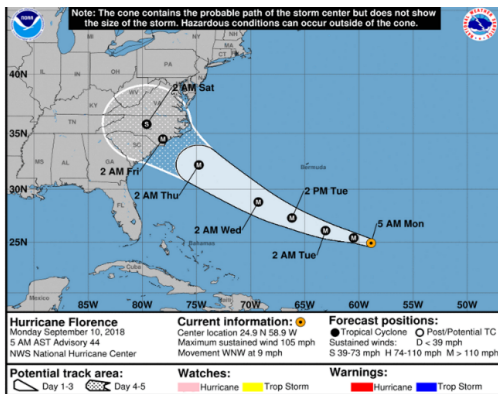

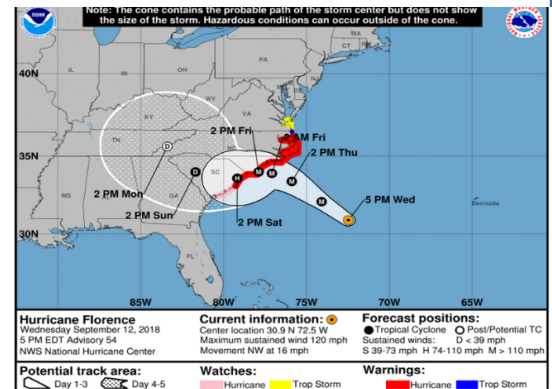
stream. Other times their path is affected by the high or low pressure of weather systems in the region they are moving toward.

In 2018, Hurricane Florence followed a very unusual path, going west/northwest, and then slowing. But it was a cat 2 hurricane even 10 days before landfall, far to the east and south of Bermuda. The next day's prediction has it moving south and further west, not curving to the north but heading to the coast of South and North Carolina. Even though the wind speeds have dropped, central pressure has not risen and its path is headed straight for the region of North Carolina/South Carolina coast. If you saw this forecast on Saturday morning you may have a week's warning because the storm hit on Friday morning.



able or stored in “ready bag” to go with you? These kinds of things can be time consuming, and they can make a BIG difference in how much you suffer in the aftermath of a big storm. You should also have an evacuation plan worked out in case the County mandates evacuation.

The next report shows probable landfall in Wilmington NC. In Fairfield Harbour we were in Hurricane Florence's “danger quadrant” as it made landfall in Wilmington. What's worse, the storm's track is one that will put north-easterly winds of hurricane force over Pamlico Sound. This makes a difference, that wind will push water to the south-west, into the mouth of the Neuse River and pile it up as the river narrows toward New Bern. NOAA predicted a 12 to 15-ft storm surge for New Bern, and only exaggerated by about 6 inches!



It is distinctly odd for a hurricane track to curve to the south. But even with this zigzag, the track of the storm has never moved outside it's “cone” of probability. We can see that even with this irregular zigzag, Hurricane Florence is predicted to hit Wilmington around noon on Friday, a few hours later than predicted a week ago, but the exact same spot. And as it happened, the storm did zigzag on its way, but it did not slow down that much, and did not wander from the center of its predicted ‘cone’ by more than 20 miles or so not significant in a storm that is 500+ miles across! The National Hurricane Center website of NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) is the best source for hurricane information. All the other weather channels get their information from NOAA.

Last and most important, always keep in mind that hurricanes can be deadly. Your own safety, and the safety of your family, should remain the highest priority.

Additionally, Blackbeard elects a Treasurer and Secretary annually. These important positions serve as Club Officers, but they have no voting rights on the board.

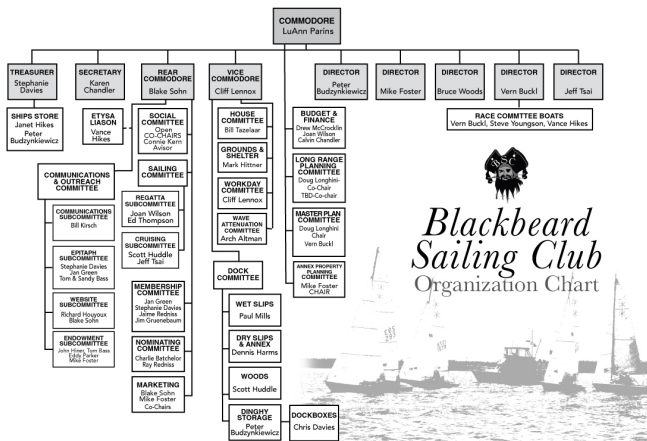

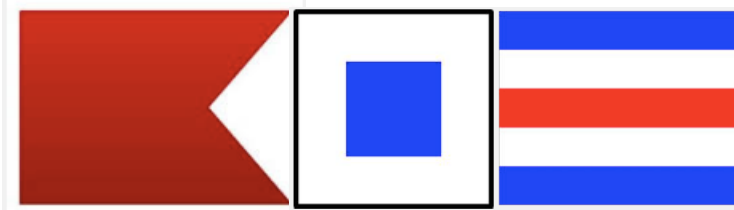

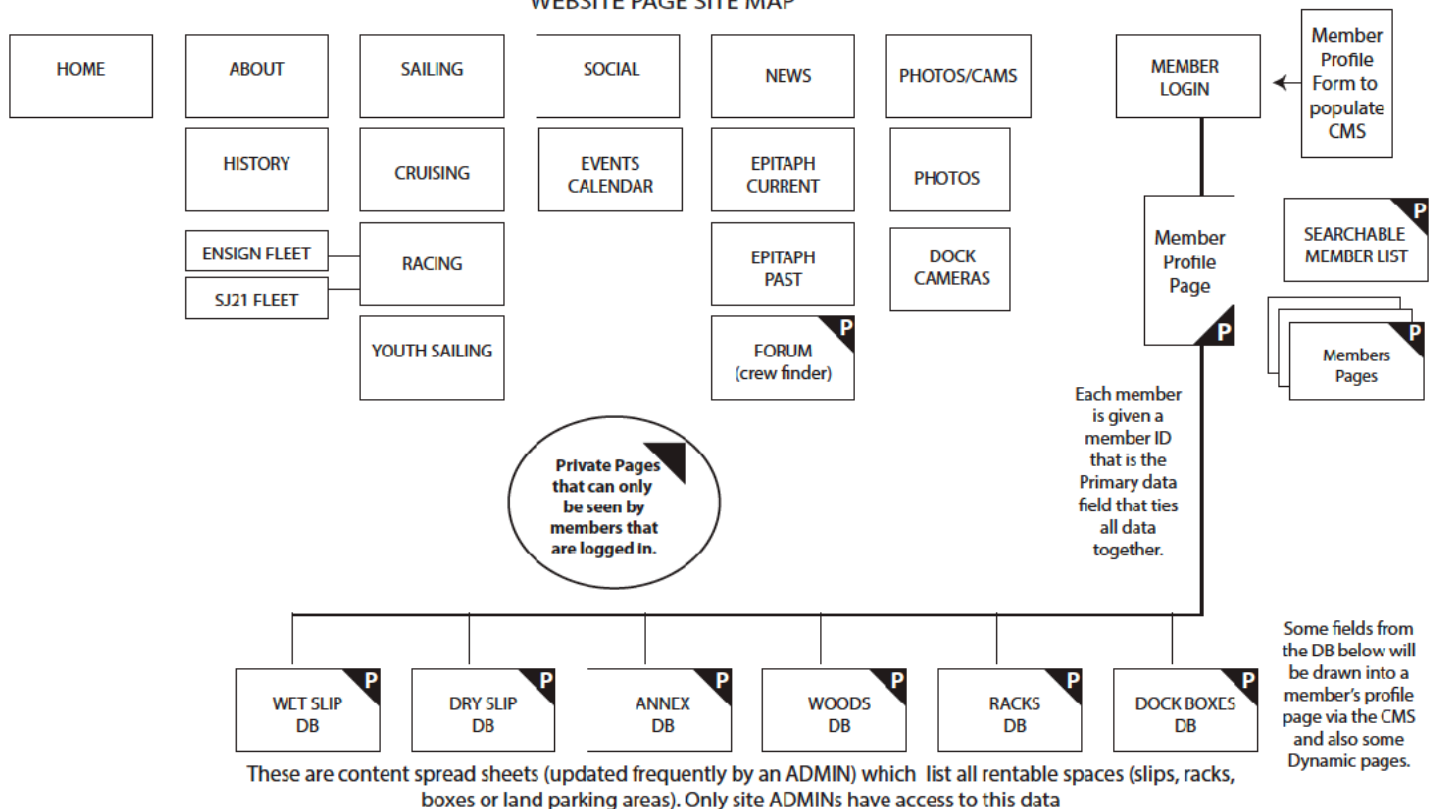
Our website has been redesigned, and as a result members must first re-sign in after a breach to utilize the new website. To do so, follow the process below:

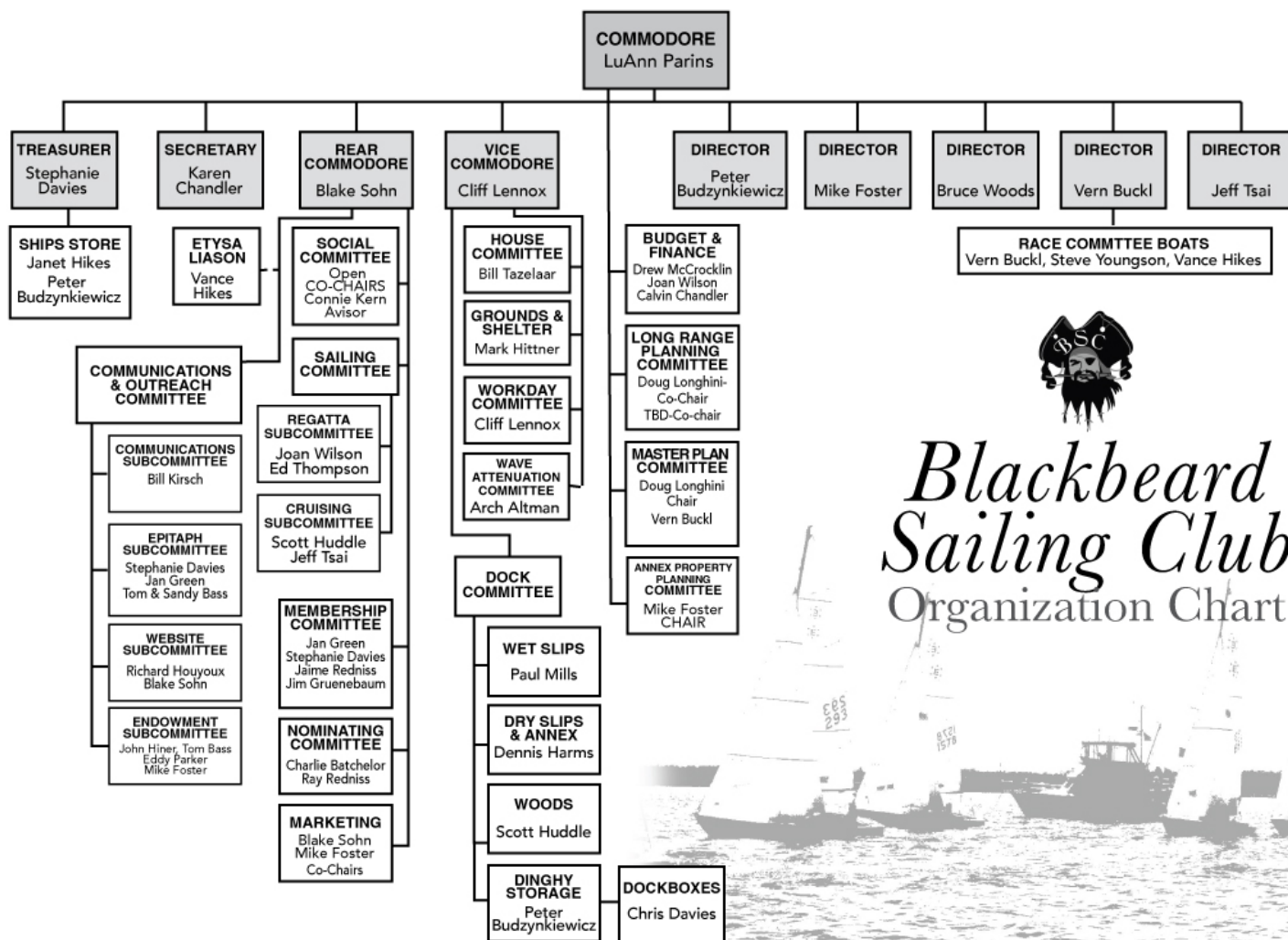
